

# Wahkiakum County Solid Waste Nuisance Ordinance



## Why is Wahkiakum County doing this?

Residents from around the county wanted it. The County Board of Commissions put the draft ordinance up for an advisory vote by the public and it overwhelmingly passed in November of 2015.

## If someone complains about me, will I receive a Notice of Violation?

Maybe. All complaints will be verified first to ensure they are prohibited by this ordinance. If you are found to be out of compliance and the county has exhausted all other avenues and agreements, the county may abate the complaint at the property owners expense. Please see the flow chart on the next page.

## What does the ordinance apply to?

Essentially, solid waste, junk and/or junk vehicles.

**Junk:** old appliance(s), equipment, junk vehicle(s), scrap metal, automotive tires, or any other items not being used for their intended purpose.

**Solid Waste:** Two or more cubic yards of material including, but not limited to, garbage, ashes, industrial wastes, swill, sewage sludge, demolition and construction wastes, junk vehicles, or junk vehicle parts.

## How to register a complaint:

Please obtain a solid waste complaint form at the Wahkiakum County Health Department. Fill it out and submit it to the administrative assistant.

## How to respond to a complaint:


Upon receiving a notice of violation, contact the County Environmental Health Specialist within 15 days of receiving the notice to secure a Voluntary Abatement Agreement with the county. Please see the flow chart for compliance pathways and outcomes.

# Wahkiakum County Solid Waste Violation Resolution Pathways

(VAA = Voluntary Abatement Agreement)





1           B. **Director** means the director of the Department.

2  
3           C. **Agricultural Equipment** is machinery originally manufactured for the purpose of:

- 4           1) Planting, harvesting, or transporting crops.  
5           2) Feeding, watering, transporting, or caring for livestock.  
6           3) Maintaining farmland.

7           D. **Junk** is defined as old appliance(s), equipment, junk vehicle(s), or significant parts thereof, scrap metal, automotive tires, and any items which are not being used for their intended purpose.

8           E. **Junk Vehicle** means an unregistered vehicle or vessel meeting at least three (3) of the following criteria:

- 9           1) is three (3) years old or older;  
10          2) is extensively damaged;  
11          3) is apparently inoperable;  
12          4) has a fair market value equivalent only to the value of scrap.

13          F. **Premises** means any building, lot, parcel, real estate, land, or portion of land whether improved or unimproved, including adjacent sidewalks and parking strips.

14          G. **Responsible Person(s)** means any legal property owner(s) and/or representative as indicated by Wahkiakum County assessor records.

15          H. **Significant Parts** of a junk vehicle means more than fifty (50) percent of any of the following:

- 16           1) chassis  
17           2) body  
18           3) engine

19          I. **Solid Waste** is defined as two (2) or more cubic yards of material including, but not limited to, garbage, rubbish, ashes, industrial wastes, swill, sewage sludge, demolition and construction wastes, junk vehicles or parts thereof, and recyclable materials, unless kept in covered bins or receptacles; Provided, that nothing herein shall prohibit the maintenance of a compost pile as long as the usage of the same is intended for the household's use.

20          J. **Vehicle** means every device capable of being moved upon a roadway and in, upon, or by which any person or property is or may be transported or drawn upon a roadway, and includes without limitation, automobiles, trucks, trailers, motorcycles, recreational vehicles, travel trailers, campers, excepting devices moved by human or animal power or used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.

1 K. **Vessel** means every watercraft used or capable of being used as a means of transportation  
2 on the water, other than a seaplane. (RCW 88.02.010)

3 **Section 3. Certification of Junk Vehicle:** Any person duly authorized under the authority of the  
4 Director shall inspect and declare under penalty of perjury that a vehicle meets the requirements of a  
5 junk vehicle. Such declaration shall be in writing and shall record the vehicle make and/or model if  
6 available. The declaration shall also describe in detail the damage or missing equipment to verify that  
7 the requirements under Section 2(E) are met.

8 **Section 4. Certification of Junk:** Any person duly authorized under the authority of the Director shall  
9 inspect and declare under penalty of perjury that the junk meets the requirements as defined in Section  
10 2(D). Such certification shall be in writing and shall describe the junk in detail to verify that the  
11 requirements under Section 2(D) are met.

12 **Section 5. Certification of Solid Waste:** Any person duly authorized under the authority of the  
13 Director shall inspect and declare under penalty of perjury that the solid waste meets the requirements  
14 as defined in Section 2(I). Such certification shall be in writing and shall describe the junk in detail to  
15 verify that the requirements under Section 2(I) are met.

16 **Section 6. Junk, Junk Vehicles and Solid Waste Prohibited:** It shall be unlawful to deposit, park,  
17 store or abandon junk and/or junk vehicles on private property that is within view from public  
18 right-of-way, public property or private property with exceptions as provided in Section 7. Such  
19 violation shall be subject to the abatement procedure set out in this ordinance.

20 **Section 7. Exceptions:** This ordinance shall not apply to:

- 21 A. Up to three junk vehicles which are not parked within 50' from the centerline of a public  
22 road or on a shared easement; and placed so as to minimize public view, and which are  
23 kept free of accumulating garbage and other health hazards.
- 24 B. Any junk and/or junk vehicles or significant parts thereof stored behind a sight-obscuring  
25 fence or densely planted evergreen hedge which is not less than six (6) feet in height or  
within a completely enclosed building where it is not visible from the public right-of-way,  
public property, or private property. The fence shall conform to current Wahkiakum  
County codes and be approved by the Director.
- C. Any junk and/or junk vehicle that is completely enclosed within a building in a lawful  
manner where it is not visible from a public or private street or road or other public or  
private property.

1 D. A junk vehicle that is stored or parked in a lawful manner on private property in connection  
2 with the business of a licensed dismantler/wrecker where the premises are fenced according  
3 to RCW 46.80.130.

4 E. Inoperable agricultural equipment located on land classified by the Wahkiakum County  
5 Assessor as farm and agricultural land (land use code 81xx, 82xx, or 83xx).

6 **Section 8. Procedures for Abatement:**

7  
8 **A. Initiation of Abatement:** Enforcement of this section may be initiated by the Director  
9 through his/her observation and/or upon receipt of a complaint given by a citizen or  
10 property owner of Wahkiakum County. Citizen or property owner initiated complaints  
11 must indicate the specific address of the property suspected to be in violation.

12 **1) Entry for the purpose of junk, junk vehicle and/or solid waste certification per**  
13 **Section 3, Section 4 and Section 5 of this ordinance;**

14 a. With permission of the landowner, the Director or a law enforcement officer  
15 is authorized to enter onto property upon which suspected junk, junk  
16 vehicles and/or solid waste exist, for the purpose of certification per Section  
17 3, Section 4 and Section 5 of this ordinance.

18 **2) Notice of Violation.** If the responsible person(s) are found to be in violation of this  
19 ordinance, a notice of violation shall be given by hand or mailed via certified mail  
20 to the responsible person(s). Notices of violation sent by certified mail shall have a  
21 five (5) day return receipt requested. This notice shall include the following:

22 a. The name and address of the responsible person(s);

23 b. The street address or other description sufficient for identification of the  
24 building, structure, premises, or land upon or within which the violation has  
25 occurred or is occurring;

c. A description of the violation and a reference to the regulation which has  
been violated;

d. The necessary corrective action to be taken, and a date or and/or time by  
which correction must be completed;

1 e. This notice may include a request of the responsible persons(s) to attempt to  
2 secure a voluntary abatement agreement with the Department within fifteen  
3 (15) days of hand delivery or the date of the postmark of the certified  
4 mailing.

5 i. **Voluntary Abatement Agreement.** The responsible person(s) may  
6 enter into a voluntary correction agreement with the Department,  
7 acting through the Director, if requested by the Director in the notice  
8 of violation.

9 ii. **Content.** The voluntary abatement agreement is a contract between  
10 the County and the responsible person(s) in which the responsible  
11 person(s) agrees to abate the violation according to the timeline and  
12 conditions specified within the voluntary abatement agreement. The  
13 voluntary abatement agreement shall include the following:

- 14 1. The name and address of the responsible person(s);
- 15 2. The street address or other description sufficient for  
16 identification of the building, structure, premises, or land  
17 upon or within which the violation has occurred or is  
18 occurring;
- 19 3. A description of the violation and a reference to the  
20 regulation which has been violated;
- 21 4. The necessary corrective action to be taken, and a date or  
22 and/or time by which correction must be completed;
- 23 5. An agreement by the responsible person(s) that the director  
24 may enter the property and inspect the premises as may be  
25 necessary to determine compliance with the voluntary  
abatement agreement;
6. An agreement by the responsible person(s) that the director  
may abate the violation and recover its costs and expenses  
(including administrative, hearing and removal costs) and/or  
a monetary penalty pursuant to this chapter from the  
responsible person(s) if the terms of the voluntary abatement  
agreement are not satisfied.

1                   iii. **Extension and Modification.** The director may grant an extension  
2 of the time limit for abatement or a modification of the required  
3 corrective action if the responsible person(s) has shown due  
4 diligence and/or substantial progress in correcting the violation, but  
unforeseen circumstances have delayed correction under the original  
conditions.

5                   iv. **Abatement by the County.** The county may abate the violation in  
6 accordance with section 12 of this ordinance if all terms of the  
voluntary abatement agreement are not met.

7                   v. **Circumstances in which a voluntary abatement agreement may**  
8 **not be included in the notice of violation.** Under the following  
9 circumstances the director may issue a notice violation which does  
not include a voluntary abatement agreement request:

- 10                               1. When an emergency exists; or
- 11                               2. When a repeat violation occurs.

12                   vi. **Collection of Costs.** If all terms of the voluntary abatement  
13 agreement are not met, the responsible person(s) shall be assessed a  
14 fine per section (8)(B)(1)(d) and costs of abatement in accordance  
15 with section 13 of this ordinance.

16 **B. Notice of Abatement and Infraction.** When the director determines that a violation of this  
17 ordinance is occurring beyond the date and/or time set in the notice of violation, or is  
18 unable to secure a voluntary abatement agreement, he or she may issue a notice of  
19 abatement and infraction. A notice of abatement and infraction shall be given by hand or  
20 mailed via certified mail to the responsible person(s). A notice of abatement and infraction  
21 sent by certified mail shall have a five (5) day return receipt requested.

22                   1. **Content.** The notice of abatement and infraction shall include the following:

- 23                               a. The name and address of the responsible person(s).
- 24                               b. The street address or description sufficient for identification of the building,  
25 structure, premises, or land upon or within which the violation has occurred  
or is occurring;
- c. A description of the violation and a reference to the provision(s) of the  
county regulation(s) that has been violated;

1 d. Fines. Monetary penalties may be assessed for violations of this ordinance  
2 via issuance of a notice of abatement and infraction. Monetary penalties for  
3 violations of this ordinance will be graduated as follows:

- 4 i. First violation – One Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$125.00)  
5 ii. Second violation – Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00)  
6 iii. Third and subsequent violations – Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00)

7 e. The required corrective action and a date and time by which the correction  
8 must be completed and, after which the county may abate the unlawful  
9 condition in accordance with this ordinance.

10 f. A notice that a public hearing may be requested before a hearing officer  
11 within fifteen (15) days from the date of hand delivery or from the date of  
12 the postmark of the notice of abatement and infraction if mailed.

13 g. A notice that the county may recover its costs and expenses (including  
14 administrative, hearing and removal costs) and/or a monetary penalty  
15 pursuant to this chapter from the responsible person(s) per section 13 of this  
16 ordinance.

17 2. **Hearing Request.** If a request for hearing is received by Wahkiakum County  
18 within fifteen (15) days of the hand delivered notice or of the postmark of the  
19 mailed notice, a notification giving the time, location and date of such hearing on  
20 the questions of abatement and removal of the junk and/or junk vehicle(s) or part(s)  
21 thereof will be sent to the person requesting the hearing of his/her authorized  
22 representative by certified mail with a five (5) day return receipt requested.

23 3. **No Hearing Request or Voluntary Abatement.** If no hearing is requested within  
24 fifteen (15) days from the date of hand delivery or from the date of the postmark of  
25 the notice of abatement if mailed and the violation has not been voluntarily abated,  
the junk, junk vehicle, significant parts thereof, or solid waste will be caused to be  
removed by the Wahkiakum County Sheriff at the expense of the responsible  
person(s) per Section 13 of this ordinance.

4. **Hearing officer.** The Director as defined in this ordinance shall serve as the  
Hearing Officer.

**Section 9. Determination of Responsibility:** The responsible person(s) shall appear in person at the  
hearing or present a written statement in time for consideration at the hearing.

1 **Section 10. Hearing:** Hearings are for the purpose of contesting the county's intent to remove junk,  
2 junk vehicle(s), or solid waste after a notice of abatement has been hand delivered or sent by certified  
3 mail to the responsible person(s). A copy of the hearing officer's written opinion will be given to the  
4 party at the conclusion of the hearing. In the event the hearing officer must take the decision under  
advisement, the written order will issue within 14 days and be mailed by certified mail to the party  
who sought the hearing.

5 **Section 11. Appeals:** The responsible person(s) may appeal the decision of the Hearing Officer  
6 directly to the Wahkiakum Board of County Commissioners. The appeal must be filed within ten (10)  
7 days of service of the final order. The petitioner will notify the hearing officer and the sheriff's office  
in writing of the petitioner's intent to appeal.

8 **Section 12. Abatement and Removal:**

9 A. The Sheriff's office will cause the removal of the junk, junk vehicle, and/or solid waste  
10 after:

- 11 1) Fifteen (15) days have elapsed after the date of the hand delivered notice or of the  
12 postmark of the mailed notice;
- 13 2) Fifteen (15) days have elapsed after the hearing officer's final decision is received  
14 by the responsible person(s) and an appeal has not been filed; or
- 15 3) Ten (10) days after an appeal to the Board of Commissioners of Wahkiakum  
16 County has been heard and denied.

17 B. Vehicle(s) or part(s) thereof will be removed by a license tow company, licensed vehicle  
18 wrecker, hulk hauler or scrap processor with notice given to the Washington State Patrol  
and to the Department of Licensing that the vehicle has been wrecked.

19 C. All other junk and/or solid waste will be removed by and disposed of by a licensed disposal  
20 company.

21 **Section 13. Costs of Removal and Disposal:** The costs of removal and disposal shall be assessed  
22 against the responsible person(s).

23 **Section 14. Severability:** If any provision or section of this ordinance shall be held void or  
24 unconstitutional all or other parts, provisions, and sections of this ordinance not expressly so held to be  
void or unconstitutional shall continue in full force and effect.

1 This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage.






### PROGRAM DETAILS

As of January 1, 2015, Washington State residents will be able to recycle mercury-containing lights at no charge, by dropping them off at authorized Collection Sites throughout Washington State. Categories of acceptable lights include fluorescent tubes, compact fluorescent lights (CFLs) and high intensity discharge lights (HIDs).

Recycling mercury-containing lights protects the environment and human health by reducing the release of mercury, a potent neurotoxin.

### LightRecycle Washington Collection Sites

Collection Sites include retailers, Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and municipal facilities throughout Washington State. Use our Collection Site locator to find a convenient drop-off point near you. Then, simply drop your unwanted mercury-containing lights off at no charge during regular business hours. Our Collection Partners will safely manage the lights until they are ready to be transported to an authorized Processor for recycling.

### Accepted Light Types And Quantities

Recycle up to 10 mercury-containing lights per day. Mercury-containing lights include lamps, bulbs, tubes used in homes, businesses, and outdoor stationary fixture


#### Compact Fluorescent Lights (CFLs)

CFLs are known for their "corkscrew" design, but also come in a wide range of shapes, sizes and styles.



#### Fluorescent Tubes

Straight or linear fluorescent tubes come in sizes from one to eight feet. Other fluorescent tubes include U-shaped and circular.




#### High Intensity Discharge (HID)

HID lamps come in a variety of shapes and sizes. HID lamp types include High Pressure Sodium, Low Pressure Sodium, Mercury Vapour, Metal Halide, Ultraviolet (UV), Ultra High Performance (UHP) and Germicidal.

### Program Funding: Mercury-Containing Lights Product Stewardship Program

LightRecycle Washington is a "Product Stewardship" program, meaning that the producers will be responsible for reducing the environmental impact of their products. Producers of mercury-containing lights that are sold in Washington State are required to fund LightRecycle Washington in order to provide a safe, efficient method for properly recycling the product at the end of its life-cycle. Funding for LightRecycle Washington comes from an Environmental Handling Charge (EHC) that is added to the price of every mercury-containing light that is sold at retail in Washington State.



The applicant agrees to abide by the following terms and conditions for this authorization to be valid:

1. A building, structure or enclosure shall be used as the authorized temporary asbestos waste storage facility and shall remain locked at all times except during transfer of asbestos-containing material or when empty.
2. All asbestos-containing waste material shall be stored in a container with a single piece liner of least 6 millimeters in thickness.
3. Containers used to store asbestos-containing waste material shall be maintained in good condition and shall be leak-tight while stored.
4. Containers shall be in a secured building or in a secured exterior enclosure or shall be secured itself.
5. The building, structure, enclosure or container used as the authorized temporary asbestos waste storage facility shall be clearly marked by asbestos warning signs on all exterior sides.  
  
If containers or wrapped materials shall be labeled using warning labels specified by either Occupational Safety and Health Standards of the Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) under 29 CFR 1910.1001(j)(4)(ii) or 1926.1101(k)(8)(iii); or WAC 296-62-07721(6)(c). The labels on the waste material and the signs on the buildings, structures, or enclosures shall be printed in letters of sufficient size and contrast so as to be readily visible and legible. All waste material stored shall be labeled with the name of the project and the location at which the waste was generated.
7. Access to the temporary asbestos storage area (building, enclosure, or structure) shall be restricted to authorized personnel.
8. Only waste asbestos-containing waste materials generated by the storage facility applicant may be stored under this temporary authorization. Asbestos-containing waste material from other waste generators is not allowed to be stored on site under this authorization.
9. Access to the authorized temporary asbestos-containing waste storage facility shall be granted to duly authorized employees of the Southwest Clean Air Agency, Washington Department of Ecology and Environmental Protection Agency for the purpose of determining compliance with this authorization and applicable regulations.

This authorization may be revoked if entry or access is refused to duly authorized representatives who requests entry for the purpose of inspection, and who presents appropriate credentials, or for any person to obstruct, hamper or interfere with any such inspection as provided under state or federal law.

## Asbestos Disposal Procedures

### Step 1

- Contact the Southwest Clean Air Agency for a *Notice of Intent to Remove or Encapsulate Asbestos*. This permit requires 24-hours advance notice and costs \$25 for residential work performed by the owner-occupant. For non-owner-occupied abatement work (e.g. contractor), the advance notice is 10 days and the fee is higher except for projects with very small amounts (see the note below).

- **Note:** If a contractor removes the asbestos-containing material, a permit is not required for any asbestos project involving **less than 10 linear feet or 48 square feet (per structure, per year)** unless the facility is to be demolished by intentional burning. If owner-occupants remove the asbestos, then the permit and fee are required regardless of the amount removed.
- **Important!** The *Notice of Intent to Remove or Encapsulate Asbestos* asks you to identify the "asbestos disposal site." If you are delivering the asbestos to the Waste Control Transfer Station, then write "Roosevelt Regional Landfill" in this space.
- **Important!** Bring a copy of the *Notice of Intent to Remove or Encapsulate Asbestos* with you when delivering asbestos to Waste Control.

### Step 2

- Perform the asbestos abatement and package the asbestos-containing waste material following state and federal regulations. The Southwest Clean Air Agency provides guidance (SWCAA 476) for lawfully removing and packaging asbestos and maintains a list of certified asbestos-abatement contractors, if needed. You can purchase 6-mil plastic bags with pre-printed asbestos warning labels for packaging asbestos at Waste Control for a reasonable cost. You must individually mark the bags with the following information (use indelible markers or labels made with indelible ink):
- Date the material was collected for disposal,
- Name of the waste generator,
- Name and affiliation of the certified asbestos supervisor, if applicable, and
- Location at which the waste was generated.

### Step 3

- Contact Waste Control (360-425-4302) a minimum of 24 hours in advance to schedule a delivery and receive pricing information. Asbestos will be accepted by appointment only. The following information will be required during scheduling and will be used to complete an *Asbestos Waste Shipment Record*:
- Name, physical address, and phone number of property owner where the asbestos was removed,
- Name, address, and phone number of asbestos-abatement contractor, if applicable,
- Description of the asbestos-containing waste material, and
- Estimated quantity of asbestos-containing waste material.

### Step 4

- Deliver the properly packaged and labeled asbestos-containing waste material to the Waste Control Transfer Station at the scheduled time. Check in at the office and sign the generator portion of the *Asbestos Waste Shipment Record*. Waste Control will give you a copy of the completed form.

### Step 5

- Hand unload all asbestos-containing waste material and place into a designated drop-box. Waste Control employees will not be able to assist you with unloading asbestos for regulatory reasons. For contractors delivering asbestos, the unloaders must have asbestos handling cards and will be required to use appropriate HEPA respirators.



### Fire Training Structure Approval

Please follow these steps when demolishing a structure by intentional burning for fire training:

1. Have the fire training structure inspected for any ACM by a certified AHERA inspector ( if no ACM is found skip to step #4 ).
2. If ACM is found have a certified asbestos contractor submit a completed *Notice of Intent to Remove or Encapsulate Asbestos* form to the Southwest Clean Air Agency (SWCAA).
3. After the 10 working day waiting period, have the certified asbestos contractor remove all of the ACM identified during the AHERA inspection.
4. Complete the *Notification of Demolition* form contained in the fire training packet. Obtain all additional permits, licenses or documents needed for this demolition project from all other local, state and federal agencies.
5. If this demolition is for fire training, obtain a completed fire training request form from the Fire Dept. that will be performing the training.
6. Take a copy of the AHERA inspection report with proof of asbestos removal (if applicable), a \$50.00 fee and the completed fire training request form to SWCAA.
7. The fire training may take place 10 working days after SWCAA has received and reviewed all required documentation.



## Solid Waste Disposal Restrictions

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Waste Control Recycling, Inc. has developed disposal restrictions to preserve the transfer station's environmental integrity, to protect the health and safety of employees and the public, and to limit operational problems.

Upon entering the transfer station facility, please notify the inbound scale attendant of the contents and place of origin of your load. For a safe and smooth visit, please follow the attendant's instructions.

To assist in planning your waste disposal and to protect the interests of Waste Control Recycling and Cowlitz County, the following will apply:

1. Only waste generated in Cowlitz or Wahkiakum Counties will be accepted. You will need to present identification to the inbound scale attendant that demonstrates your local residency or proves that the waste was generated within Cowlitz or Wahkiakum Counties. Appropriate identification includes a valid driver's license, utility bill, job bid, property tax statement, or building permit.
2. No liquid or hazardous waste in any quantity will be accepted, except for household hazardous waste or qualifying commercial waste from conditionally exempt small quantity generators. Household hazardous waste will be accepted for free from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. on Tuesdays and Saturdays. Small quantity generator waste will be accepted for a fee and by appointment only.
3. Medical or surgical residues from any medical facility will not be accepted.
4. Toxic, infectious, or radioactive materials will not be accepted.
5. Drums or barrels will not be accepted unless a) empty, b) at least one end removed, and c) triple-rinsed if they contained a hazardous or dangerous product. You will be required to sign a statement certifying that the drum has been triple-rinsed.
6. Radioactive and/or explosive material will not be accepted.
7. Automotive gas tanks or pressurized tanks, whether empty or full, will not be accepted.
8. Sawdust, bag-house dust, or material causing excessive dust will not be accepted unless bagged.
9. Asbestos waste-containing material may be accepted with pre-arranged approval. Please contact Waste Control for scheduling, fee schedule, and disposal requirements.
10. Tires larger than highway truck tires will not be accepted. Acceptable tires must be separated and dumped in designated area.
11. Stumps, logs (including roots), and other wood waste greater than 3-foot diameter and 5-foot length will not be accepted. Wood waste within the accepted size limits must be free of dirt. All brush must be separated and dumped in designated area.
12. Treated or creosote timbers are acceptable, but must be separated and dumped in an area designated by an attendant. The timber lengths must not be longer than 8 feet.



## Solid Waste Disposal Restrictions

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13. Concrete, demolition debris, or construction debris larger than 4-feet by 1-foot (4' x 1') will not be accepted. Dimensional sheet goods larger than 4-feet by 12-feet (4' x 12') will not be accepted.
14. Industrial sludges, sewer sludges, petroleum- or chemical-contaminated soils or debris will not be accepted.
15. Mill waste in excess of an average of 60 cubic yards per day will not be accepted.
16. Wire, cable, or steel binding of any size will not be accepted unless they are cut into length of 6-feet or less.
17. Residential motor oil and antifreeze are accepted for free at 12 locations throughout our service area and at the transfer station. Ask an attendant for locations nearest you or for available disposal options for businesses.



- An invoice for waste received will be given to the person delivering the waste. We do not accept payment at time of delivery. Cowlitz County Public Works, sponsor of the SQG Hazardous Waste Collection Program, will invoice you for the disposal cost.

#### Important Instructions

- We **do not accept** explosive, reactive, biological/infectious, radioactive, or unknown material, or compressed gas cylinders.
- Materials must be in properly labeled, leak-proof and spill-proof containers.


